



The **Alabama Best Practices Center (ABPC)** facilitates high-quality, network-based, collaborative professional learning. [Our networks have proven success in improving student achievement in math and reading for participating schools.](#) In its 20 years, ABPC has served 116 of the state's 139 districts—in all, more than 400,000 of Alabama's 740,000 students. Our team supports and facilitates professional learning based on the research-based principles of adult learning.



The **Key Leaders Network (KLN)** connects district and school leaders to foster effective leadership practices that improve teaching and learning. Participants speak of the value of networking with peers from across the state and the takeaways they gain from interacting with others. The guiding text for the year is *Leading a High Reliability School*, by Marzano, et al. This year, KLN will connect leaders to strategies that strengthen district and school cultures as they address the challenges caused by the pandemic.

The **Powerful Conversations Network (PCN)** connects teachers to each other to hone their knowledge and skills and improve teaching and learning. Marzano's *The New Art and Science of Teaching* will be the guiding text. Teachers will meet in grade bands and/or subject areas planning and identifying lessons for the essential standards they find most challenging to teach. Social and emotional learning will be integrated throughout the lessons.



Meetings will offer:

- Synchronous and asynchronous virtual learning
- Intentional networking of teachers from across the state
- Two full-day, in-person meetings with colleagues from across your region within your network
- Responsiveness and flexibility to meet district and school needs throughout the year
- ALSDE CEU's awarded upon completion
- ACLD approved PLUs awarded to those who meet the meeting requirements

Program Components

Both networks will use a blended learning structure with both in-person and virtual meetings. The 1st & 3rd meetings will be virtual while the 2nd & 4th meetings will be face-to-face. We will also offer a fully virtual network based on demand.

Team Structure

KLN: Teams of up to six leaders, comprised of a good mix of district and school-based leaders. Larger districts can configure multiple teams to ensure broader understanding and implementation.

PCN: Teams of 3-6 educators, with at least one administrator from the same school. Districts frequently send teams from multiple schools to ensure broader implementation of the learning.

Pricing is the same for both networks

Blended Network: **\$425/person**

Fully Virtual Network: **\$325/person**
